PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Chambers amendment. I think that this is paragraph two. REcord. Have you voted? Have you voted? REcord.

CLERK: 16 ayes and 13 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Chambers, how many more are there now that we are severing them?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: There are two and I don't mind Senator Kelly.....

Senator Kelly has a motion on the desk. Read Kelly motion.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I apologize for breaking in on Senator Chambers proposals and I ask your indulgence. My absence from the state the last few days on state business precluded me from having this follow the normal order as we have established the last few years of passing a resolution for the Loup and O'Neal project and one for the mid-state. My absence asked that we....or causes me to ask you to suspend the rules so that we make accept this resolution, pass it and the Clerk's office will then have time to do the clerical work so that the mid-state people when they appear before the appropriations committee next Tuesday in Washington will have their annual nod of approval from this body. I thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there any discussion of the resolution? Senator Fowler.

SENATOR FOWLER: Well are we discussion the suspension of the rules or the Resolution. I have some questions on the Resclution.

PRESIDENT: Alright, I'm sorry. He has moved to suspend the rules so if there is argument on that lets argue that. Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I don't want to argue it, I just want to ask a question of why it couldn't have been taken up after we finished with Senator Chambers when we are in the middle of something stop and start working on a resolution? Why didn't we finish with the other one.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Clerk could you respond to that.

CLERK: The only point that I had with Senator Kelly was that if he wanted it adopted today he should do it this morning so that we would have time to enroll it yet this afternoon, if we can't get it in soon enough to enroll it then you have accomplished nothing.
