SENATOR MARESH: But you agree that there should be no local law to the state should define this, that we should . . .

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll agree on Select File.

SENATOR MARESH: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Mr. President, members of the body, I have visited with Senator Chambers about this. I had some concern when he originally drafted it. I visited with the Department of Motor Vehicles this morning even, Senator Chambers, about the case which he circulated around. I agree with him completely. If it is, and I'm sure it is, crystal clear that it doesn't mean you can get by with driving on a suspended license and not have points lost and this type of thing. Driving without a license in your pocket has nothing to do with your ability to drive a car and be safe. Let's vote on it and go. Right.

PRESIDENT: There being no further discussion, do you care to close? Alright. The question is the adoption of Senator Chambers amendment number 3, I believe. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I move that the bill is advanced . . . I mean as amended be advanced.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Senator Chambers moves that the bill as amended be advanced to E & R initial. Is there any discussion? Senator Kremer. Alright. Question is the advancement of the bill. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. LB 455.

CLERK: Read title. There are committee amendments by Senator Carstens Revenue Committee.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Carsten.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the amendment that was offered by Senator Anderson's committee only stipulates that the failure to file a certificate shall not disqualify the qualified applicant from receiving the homestead exemption. I believe that this would provide an extra protection there for the people that are really qualified for it and not penalize them for it. I would move for the adoption of the amendment, Mr. President.
