CLERK: Senator Goodrich voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Goodrich votes aye. Senator Cope votes nay. Senator Stoney aye.

CLERK: Senator Kelly voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly voting aye.

CLERK: Cope voting nay.

SENATOR DWORAK: Could I have a roll call vote Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Do we have enough in here to start the roll? Whose missing? Commence the roll.

CLERK: Senator Anderson--voting aye.
Senator Barnett--voting no.
Senator Bereuter--voting aye.
Senator Burbach--excused.
