SENATOR F. LEWIS: OK, I would ask that you lay this motion over for a day until I have had time to look at it.

PRESIDENT: Is this a request for unanimous consent?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Well Senator Kennedy do you request....do you object to the request for unanimous consent?

SENATOR KENNEDY: NO, if the legal time and I know that it was late last night when I received this notice from the Attorney General, and I did go over and it was probably around 5:30 and the Governor was not aware of it...

PRESIDENT: Yes, but do you object to the unanimous request?

SENATOR KENNEDY: If we have the legal time, is that correct?

PRESIDENT: No, you either object or you don't object.

SENATOR KENNEDY: (inaudible) mike not activated.

PRESIDENT: OK, Would you care to make a motion Senator Lewis? What bracket it until tomorrow?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Yes, Mr. President, I am surprised that Senator Marsh....

PRESIDENT: Well I guess that we don't bracket requests.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: What I am doing is asking that this motion be laid over. I move that the motion be laid over until tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: Alright, Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, with all due respects to Senator Lewis, he might like to notice in his little black book that this was presented to the Governor on the 25th, it either becomes law tomorrow without the Governor's signature or the Governor will be forced to veto it if it is unconstitutional. Perhaps he would like to change his motion.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: The Clerk just said May 1st. I don't know.

PRESIDENT: You obligation to determine these matters Senator. The record is there for all of us to see.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: May 1 is the correct time and I would certainly hope that the Clerk would be able to advise me of those things. It is May 1, that is the date.

PRESIDENT: Well, that determination has to be made. The question is shall this matter be laid over until tomorrow. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 12 nays.
