SPEAKER: I have no objections. I have not denied anyone their opportunity to have their bills at the proper place. When there is so much absenteeism around this place, including myself, I don't know how to do, after I've been told by you from Washington that you did not want to discuss LB 123 till next Monday, I must comply to your wishes. That's exactly what I've done. If you can make some type of a change, Senator Syas has a motion here for that. I can't possibly because of the practice of this body not to discuss bills when the introducer is not here. If you care to do something this is the order I established. If this body wants to change those numbers I have no objections. I'm trying to comply with the things this body wants in an orderly fashion. I was very disappointed when you would not let me sit LB 123 for earlier discussion this week, instead of waiting till Monday morning.

SENATOR KEYES: Friday or Monday was perfectly alright with me Jules. If this is the way it is that's just danty.

SPEAKER: I have had a late request. Because of circumstances beyond the introducers control, he is asking to replace, hopefully this forenoon or right around lunch time, 421 with 417 . . . strike 477 and discuss 421. I'd like to point out one thing to this body. It is difficult to satisfy everyone here. I have asked that the names, the numbers, the bills be sent to me. Now then Senator Skarda asked for this change and I was agreeable to it because it's not changing anything in the order of over-ride and so forth. I said if you prefer this we'll do this. Senator Duis now makes a request he will take 477. He did not have a bill up at this time. He has one tomorrow.

PRESIDENT: We move to the second item under 7. Senator Savage.

CLERK: Motion on the desk Mr. President. I move to return LB 387 to Select File for a specific amendment. Signed, Senator Savage. The specific amendment is found on page 1508 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: The Chair would like to inquire Senator Savage, do you anticipate protracted debate on your motion to return, or do you prefer that that be done if it is returned?

SENATOR SAVAGE: I don't expect any debate at all.

PRESIDENT: You mean on the motion to return? Alright. Could you keep your statement on it brief then so that any argument can come once it's returned.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Due to anticipated shortages, as I told you the other day, in Revenue and because of the increasing value of the 10 acre property that used to be the Good Shepard Home, as a necessity to the future of the University of Nebraska Medical School expansion, and the promise of a veto by the Governor, should we have the entire amount paid
