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personally wrong with the bill. The Mayor is an honorable man. The city council, I think they need . . . I'm trying to fulfill. I think it's a legitimate cause.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I don't think there's much of a problem with this at all. Omaha has reached that area in size that they've got the problem of being in this business of providing entertainment. For this type of thing it's only going to be used at the discretionary periods of time when it's most necessary. I think that as you move into 1976 it's the type of thing that cities of equal population also provide in the way of beverages. I think that the bill is needed at this time. We have just reached that stage in our life of a municipal city where this type of services are required.

PRESIDENT: Senator Swigart.

SENATOR SWIGART: Mr. President, colleagues, I'm not going to put up a big fight against it. I see nothing wrong with it at the Orphium. But gosh here's another case, ladies and gentlemen, of kind of double standards. I think the legislators should be aware that every other owner of licenses in the State of Nebraska can only have two. This is one of the things that kind of divides the ordinary citizen from the government. They say now here the government has passed a law saying that no owner of a license can have more than two, but it's OK for the government. For that reason I think it makes it very difficult for us to live as participants in government when we're enforcing to the nth degree the law that says you can only have two. Then we turn around and give ourselves the privilege in government of having more. Is that right?

PRESIDENT: Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, question of Senator Skarda. Senator, will the Orphium continue to provide the water fountain for Senator Dickinson?

SENATOR SKARDA: Well I imagine so.

SENATOR GEORGE: OK, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cope.

SENATOR COPE: Question of Senator Skarda. The fiscal impact of \$11,521 . . . is that . . .

SENATOR SKARKA: It's 421, Senator.

SENATOR COPE: 421, OK, give or take a hundred. That means the state . . . it will cost the state that much for the very few times that it's going to be used in Omaha? Is that correct?
