CLERK: Mr. President, a motion on the desk.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Read the motion.

CLERK: It is to adjourn, but just before that Senator Koch asks unanimous consent to print amendments to 423 in the Journal.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Any objections?

CLERK: Mr. President, I move we adjourn. Signed, Senator Syas.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Chair recognizes Senator Syas. Senator Mahoney.

SENATOR MAHONEY: You decided in order of rank here. Your Speaker is not here and Senator Syas wants to go home. We ought to finish this bill and then I think I'll make the motion. I don't think you should usurp the powers at this time.

SENATOR SYAS: (mic inactivated) . . . debate on adjournment, I think there's 12 lights up there so you're going to be here at 8 o'clock, unless there's more lights, you're going to be here at 8 o'clock on this bill. Twelve lights! Have you checked that, Senator?

SENATOR MAHONEY: I did, Senator Syas. I'll be truthful with my word, when it hits 6 o'clock we shall go home. We'll listen to the rest of the lights tomorrow.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Motion to adjourn. Record your vote. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 6 ayes, 24 nays.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Motion fails. Chair recognizes Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the body, I have a question I'd like to address to Senator Chambers. Senator Chambers, would you yield?

SENATOR SAVAGE: Will you yield Senator Chambers?

SENATOR MILLS: Senator Chambers, I don't know if you know it, I really don't care . . .

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Probably not, so you can instruct me.

SENATOR MILLS: No, but I wanted to tell you I have followed your food tax. I supported you on it. I believe the same way you believe, however, we have a different opinion about this. I'd like to ask you, Senator Chambers, are you familiar with the taxation that has happened to corporations, and they really aren't called corporate structures but they're almost the same, in Sweden?
