SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I move we remove the Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the Call be raised. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays.

PRESIDENT: Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: Mr. President, I move to indefinitely postpone LB 204. Signed, Senator Chambers.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Chambers . . . lays over on Select, forgot. Senator Dworak, LB 340.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the Enrollment and Review amendments to LB 340.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? All those in favor say aye, contrary nay. The amendments are adopted. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, there are a series of amendments offered by Senator Richard Lewis to LB 340.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Richard Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I do have some amendments to offer on this particular bill. I've given a copy to . . .

PRESIDENT: I'm going to ask again for a little more order so that Senator Richard Lewis can get the courtesy that he gives other members.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: Is Senator Syas in accord?

PRESIDENT: Well we don't know. The jury is out on Senator Syas.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: With your permission I'll proceed Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Yes, thank you Senator Lewis.

SENATOR R. LEWIS: My purpose in these amendments is to try and determine that the public, the retailer, and the public through the retailer price takes . . . is given the advantage of sharing in this reduction in costs to the wholesaler that should result if this affirmation law is enacted.
