PRESIDENT: Or accounted for. The membership has to be accounted for.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Is that . . .

PRESIDENT: The Clerk has advised me that that now has occurred.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 4 nays on motion to raise the Call.

PRESIDENT: The Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 18 nays now Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Do you want to advance 340?

PRESIDENT: Well Senator Lewis says he has an amendment. Chair recognizes Senator Frank Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I have an amendment on the desk up there.

PRESIDENT: Do you have an amendment from Senator Frank Lewis, Mr. Clerk?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: That's my amendment.

PRESIDENT: Would a Page take it to Senator Lewis so it can be signed.

CLERK: Read amendment found on page 1589 of Journal.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I apologize to the membership for not following the correct procedure. Sometimes it's very difficult for me to find out what the correct procedure is. I'm learning. I'd ask that the amendment would be adopted. This was suggested that wine be taken out at the public hearing. We didn't do that in committee at that particular point in time.
