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you've just made, leave that pending and then we just pass over this particular bill and go on to the budget bills until tomorrow? Do you object to that?

SENATOR MARVEL: Well . . . I'd just as soon, Senator Goodrich, if the purpose is to check with the Attorney General and find out if there's a potential unconstitutionality I'd just as soon adopt this amendment and move the bill across, then if there's a problem tomorrow you can bring it up. I think we, because of the shortage of time, I think we have to move legislation, if acceptable by the Legislature, move it ahead because we're going to run into a time bind. I'm not trying to play games with you, I just think that . . .

SENATOR GOODRICH: Alright let's try it on a different approach then. If we go ahead and adopt this particular amendment and then hold the bill right here, since the bill is no longer on General File, it's on Select File, we can just finish it up anytime we want to in the last five days, for example. If we wanted to we could pass this particular bill. At least is we adopt this particular amendment and then hold the bill right here do you agree to that?

SENATOR MARVEL: It's not my bill so all I'm trying to do is put this amendment on, then it's up to the introducers of the bill to determine that. I don't think it makes any difference whether you hold it after the rest of the amendments are considered, whether you hold it here or whether you advance it. I don't think it makes that much difference.

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK. Would Senator Lewis, then, yield to a question? Senator Lewis, would you give us your thinking relative to what we should do? I, for one, have some serious doubts as to the constitutionality of the bill with the first Marvel amendment. The second Marvel amendment really gives me some question also. I haven't had time to check the constitutionality of that one. What's your thinking relative to holding this bill till tomorrow so that we can get some Attorney General opinions on it?

SENATOR F. LEWIS: I've talked to Senator Kremer. It's his bill. I think he's agreeable that we hold the bill on Select File, as it is, and come back to it either tomorrow or the next day. That would be at the prerogative of the introducer. I would agree with what Senator Kremer wants to do. It was my understanding that he agreed to bracket the bill.

SENATOR GOODRICH: OK. Would Senator Kremer yield to a question then? Same question.

SENATOR KREMER: In answer to your question, Senator, I'm going to ask that the bill be held on Select File, once it moves ahead and then if there are other amendments . . . there's going to be a number of them I'm sure including some of my own. We'd have to jockey around by bringing it back each time and moving it ahead and bringing it back. This way, in its present position, we can do about anything that we want with it. I'm going to ask that it be held. I may not win because I haven't been lately.
