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issues like the one I'm talking about here this morning. Peoples personal philosophy's are going to be trampled on. Their attitude toward corporations and the people they know who are in these corporations that they'd like to protect, all of that is going to be trampled into the dust. After the smoke clears some kind of provision has to be hammered out by this Legislature which can be converted into law. The purpose of this bill that we're dealing with now, I think, may be as Senator Keyes says to unify taxation. I think it's to raise revenue. I'm going to support it. I don't believe Senator Warner can stand up on this floor and say that he thinks no corporate interests have lobbied this bill. I don't believe he can say that he thinks their lobbying has had no influence or effect whatsoever. He himself has seen the power that they have on the interest or the usury bill. For him to be consistent, I'd like to see him stand up when we reconsider that bill and take up his kill motion. I'd like to see him stand up and say that the lobbyists have not influenced any votes in this body, that special interest groups have not pushed hard on this bill. I'd like to see him on Senator Murphy's banking bill say the same thing. Those statements cannot be said and validated. Notice I didn't say they couldn't be said, I said and be validated. On this floor open and free wheeling discusssion, I think, is the best possible thing that can occur. When you make pointed sharp statements that penetrate the surface what is really in people comes out. That's what we need to get to to understand what we're grappling with here. Polite, congenial conversation which hides deceptiveness, falsehoods and dishonesty should be done away with. The only way sometimes to do away with it is with the biting ridicule and sarcasm and irony that some people have an ability to utilize. For my part anything I can do with words to try to move this body to do what I think is right I'm going to do. That's what everyone in this body does. We just have different methods of doing it. I think mine is effective for me with the abilities and temperments I have. You feel that yours is effective for you. To try to cut off discussion in the way that Senator Warner seemed to be doing this morning, maybe I misunderstood his intent, I think is a terrible thing and it's not going to work on me. I believe that the amendment which is being offered, by the way, is not satisfactory. It will move this bill off General File, I think. As it moves across the board I'll probably have comments about the power and the pressure that special interest groups can exert on this Legislature, and they do determine the outcome of legislation here.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, it's only 9:30 and we aren't even on the bill anymore. I call for the previous question. We discussed this one pretty thoroughly yesterday, this amendment, this issue.

PRESIDENT: Are there seconds? I see five seconds. The question is shall debate cease on the Barnett amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.
