PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DE CAMP: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the amendments specifically as you recall relate to the problems of Pioneer Insurance and the possible influence of the bill on that particular company and their particular problems. I asked at that time and received permission and agreement from Senator Duis to hold the bill until some matters could be resolved and some things could happen. In the 10 days or two weeks since that request was made, several things have happened. The insurance department, the insurance commission is suing the banks that they were formerly working with on it, and the banks are suing the insurance department, officials of the state of California are filing an action that will be served on the Secretary of State here next week for \$250,000,000 for fraud, and I have received assurance from the Director of the Department of Insurance that he does not now intend to utilize the bill with regards to Pioneer. So my amendments are not necessary at this time. I would ask unanimous consent to withdraw them. I think that the developments and future of the other problem will have to have some resolution here in the Legislature later on, but the bill, or the amendments now are not necessary because of the later developments. I ask unanimous consent to withdraw those particular amendments.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered. Senator Dworak.

CLERK: NOW Mr. President, does that apply to both A & B amendments, Senator? OK.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: I move that LB217 be advanced to E & R for Engrossment.

PRESIDENT: Discussion. All those in favor say aye, contrary nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President LB14, the E & R amendments were adopted. The bill was laid over, there is presently an amendment offered by Senator Rasmussen to LB14, the amendments are set out in full in the Journal on page 1644.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body, what this amendment does is it allows the state department of agriculture to go out and take a sample or an analysis from a commercial sprayer. I don't know how many members of this body have problems with people coming up and saying that they are not putting the spray in or that chemical in or that. I visited with Senator Schmit on this and he agreed that it would probably be a good amendment to put on so I would ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Question is the adoption of Senator Rasmussen's amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted. Clerk will record.
