SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I was not trying to object I wanted to inquire if the bill is bracketed that I concur with. I would like to ask the Chairman of the Budget Committee that if the full impact of 611 could be provided to the Legislature by the ... next Tuesday?

PRESIDENT: Could that be done, Senator Marvel?

SENATOR WARNER: The reason I ask, Senator Marvel, is I understand it might be \$30 to \$50 million in obligation. I think the Legislature ought to know it.

PRESIDENT: Could that be provided by Tuesday? Alright, now are there objections to the bracketing? Seeing none ... oh, excuse me. Alright, the question is shall the bill be bracketed till Tuesday. Record your vote. Oh, I'm sorry. Senator Lewis.

SENATOR F. LEWIS: Mr. Chairman, this again is one of those things where we have some interest level of bills that are running concurrently. It's our intention, and I believe it's been cleared with the Speaker, that 344 will be addressed on General File on Monday, when we can get the determination of the Legislature, & then the action accordingly on 611. I'd ask that we kind of look at those two together. I'm going to ask the body ... I've talked to the Speaker about it ... after the disposition of 344 on Monday that we go to General File and take up 216 which is the appropriation bill for the community technical schools, and put the amount of money in there for the way the Legislature determines that 344 should operate. That's the reason for my motion to bracket. I hope that you concur.

PRESIDENT: Anyone else wish to speak to the matter of bracketing? The question is shall 611 be bracketed until Tuesday. Record your vote. Please vote. Have you voted? Has everyone voted? Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 8 nays on the motion to bracket until May 13th.

PRESIDENT: The bill is bracketed.

CLERK: And the Warner amendment will be pending.
