PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Mills amended amendment. Record your vote. Have you all voted? Please vote. Record.

SENATOR MILLS: I don't want to call for the House, its an insult to call for the House.

PRESIDENT: Doesn't seem to be very prudent, I don't know about insulting. Record Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 9 ayes, 15 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: There are no further amendments. Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: A question of Senator Burbach. Senator Burbach, I'm going to vote for the bill but I'm going to ask some of the things that I'm going to ask is for reasons that if I have a neighbor get into trouble I want to be able to go into Legislative history and say what was intended. Under the reporting, would or would not, and I can think of a neighbor that does this, if he as he usually does rented 80 acres of corn stalks by the acre, and he is a Sub-Chapter S, if he failed to report that would he then be subject to the thousand dollar fine or whatever the fine is?

SENATOR BURBACH: I understand the problem and I know that it is a very prevalent practice. I suppose that it would be under that year and it is January 1st and I suppose that I would have to say yes, that if he failed to report but I don't know if we had grazing in this or not, and that is a matter of grazing and I don't know if the definition would cover grazing or not. I'm sorry but I can't answer you directly. If grazing is agricultural pursuits as defined earlier in the bill then I'm sure that he would be. But if grazing is not considered as the operation of agricultural levity was none, then that is not a very clear answer.

SENATOR WARNER: Could I suggest Senator Burbach that if the Secretary of State was making out the forms of rules and regulations do you think that he could exclude the leasing of land for a period of less than 12 months? Unless it was 10 months? Or 6 months?

SENATOR BURBACH: Six months I think would cover the thing that you are concerned about. I would like to have this as a matter of record that the Secretary of State does not consider the lease for grazing purposes and other purposes which we can not imagine right now at a the moment.

SENATOR WARNER: Even four to six months Senator Burbach I think would cover most of those.

SENATOR BURBACH: I think that you are right Senator Warner.

PRESIDENT: Senator Koch.
