SENATOR KELLY: What would be the need for....

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: This is a Cash Fund appropriation. I am sorry. I should have...

SENATOR KELLY: It is not General Fund, then, it is Cash Fund.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Correct.

SENATOR KELLY: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is, shall LB 607 be returned for specific amendment. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays on motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator Cavanaugh.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, the motion is the adoption of the Cavanaugh specific amendment.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I move the amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion. The question is, the adoption of the amendment. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh moves to advance the bill. All those in favor say aye. Contrary nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, we are ready for LB 610. There are # & R amendments on the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: I am not sure what number we are on.

CLERK: 610.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 610.

PRESIDENT: Discussion. The question is the adoption of the amendments to 610. All those in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, I have a series of amendments pending to LB 610. The first is an amendment offered by Senator George Burrows. I believe this amendment was offered on Select File and then withdrawn and reoffered on Select File. It reads as follows: For every dollar increase in Cash as a result of a tuition increase above existing rates there should be an equal offsetting decrease in state General Fund. Signed Senator Burrows.

PRESIDENT: Senator William Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Mr. President, is the amendment, the Committee amendment on that that applies to yet? That
