PRESIDENT: Senator Mahoney, for what purpose do you rise?

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I could read your lips and I could perhaps just say that he did bring my name in his debate.

PRESIDENT: Well that was appropriate close. The Chair will allow further response to the new matter brought up by Senator Kelly and only that.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Also in compliance with the Speakers request it is important that I say that when Senator Kelly brought in the fact that the English language was there and the reading of this material, it is important that this Legislature knows that this new material he has presented to you is telling the people who run our medical school exactly that the Legislature is going to get into the act and were going to require them to do certain things in the training of their finishing product of the family practice. I think that this is wrng. I don't think that we should do this at all. Those beautiful words come out as Senator Kelly has responded to the fact that they must move according to what the accreditation board of the American Medical College is. If they say that they are preapred with one school this year, and they can come up with two or three or five years, this is the course that we should take. The experts are the people that are the professors of the medical school. If we start dilly-dally and tell the medical school how to run their operation this is wrong for this legislature to do it and we should send a resounding message back to the school that we trust them and that we want to trust them and we continue to trust them and reject the Kelly amendment to this bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kelly you do have a right to a re-close in reply to the response of Senator Mills on the new matter that you brought up in your original close.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, colleagues, the only thing that I would say is that this is to be a state wide system but nobody has talked to anybody in the state wide area to see if we can establish these programs. Senator Mills believes that the out-state cities can not establish these programs, and I am positively convinced that the out-state cities can establish these programs and that would be the conflict on the new matter Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the bill be returned for a specific amendment. Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.
