CLERK: 10 ayes 19 nays and 20 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, motion on the desk.

PRESIDENT: Read the motion. Read Keyes amendment to LB249.

CLERK: Read the Keyes amendment.

SENATOR KEYES: Did Senator Mills have an amendment on this bill?

PRESIDENT: It was just defeated.

SENATOR KEYES: I'll withdraw this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Next amendment.

CLERK: Read Chambers amendment to 311.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, this is the same amendment that appeared in the Journal. I don't have the page number but it relates to the Public Service Commission and the amendment that I handed around to you in the interest of trying to save time. To explain to you what the misunderstanding was between Senator Moylan and myself, his bill is designed to give a salary increase to the members of the Public Service Commission. That has been increased by the committee that heard the bill to \$20,000. Senator Moylan thought that I was going to amend the bill to raise the amount to \$25,000 in an attempt to kill the bill. Well I'm not trying to raise the salary at all, and I'm not going to touch the salary. That will remain the same at the \$20,000 that the committee inserted and the majority of the members endorsed. This is designed to do the things on that paper that I handed around to you. That is what the specific amendment will be. So if you have any questions, I will take them, but I hope that you have had a chance to read it over and consider it. Senator Moylan and I did work out the disagreement and I told him that I would tell you on the floor and make it crystal clear that this amendment does nothing with reference to the salary.

CLERK: The specific amendment is on page 1636 of the Journal with the exception of paragraph two, which has been deleted. Sub-paragraph two.

PRESIDENT: The question is shall the bill be returned for a specific amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Have you voted? Record. Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: A call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Question is shall the house go under call. Record your vote. Please vote.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'll ask for a roll call vote.
