PRESIDENT: Commence reading the roll. I take it that you have withdrawn your call of the house. Please give the Clerk your attention.

CLERK: Roll call. 21 ayes, 7 nays and 21 not voting. Vote appears on page 1821 of the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: Read, Warner amendment to LB305.

PRESIDENT: Chair recognizes Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, the purpose of this amendment, I offered an amendment on Select File which would make it unnecessary or would not have required an individual to pay for and buy a sticker, or an inspection sticker on a new car that had not previously been used. You perhaps recall that I indicated that a dealer is normally paid as a part of the servicing fee for that. Most dealers I understand did not charge in any event, but it would put an amendment on the department feels that the wording is such that they would have to provide the sticker at no cost to the dealer, and the amendment would require the reimbursement of those stickers the same as any other just purely as administrative problems that they would have no way of knowing which stickers went on new cars, which didn't and so the purpose of the amendment is to make it clear that a new car dealer would buy so many tickers or stickers as they now do and they could put them on any car that was appropriate but to ease the administrative question. They felt, the department felt that it was not perfectly clear that they could charge for these. That is all the amendment does.

PRESIDENT: Senator Swigart.

SENATOR SWIGART: Mr. President, members. Senator Warner would you yield to a question? How does this leave it now? In the bill now as amended, is it true that it will be that they have to take the wheel off and check the brakes?

SENATOR WARNER: In the bill as a whole?

SENATOR SWIGART: Yes.

SENATOR WARNER: As I recall Senator Swigart that was stricken by Senator Mills amendment, but perhaps he could correct that.

PRESIDENT: That is not part of the question, that has nothing to do with the amendment.

SENATOR WARNER: I believe that is true.

SENATOR SWIGART: Could I ask that of Senator Mills?

PRESIDENT: No, the Chair would have to restrict that. That is not proper discussion under this amendment Senator, I'm sorry.
