SENATOR SIMPSON: I think that there are a couple of other things that I would like to mention along with it. I would start by saying that you know that some of us stuck our necks out here to get this started so were really concerned about this, and I have stuck my neck out further yet in that being contacted yesterday that the department of health was unwilling to pay the way of anyone else to go to California. So as the inter-governmental chairman of the Legislature, I did authorize either an additional person from the Department of Health or one from the Department of Economic Development having to do with community relations mostly to go out and assist and help these local communities. Now we have had to do that from the Legislative angle. It seems like things are now kind of snowballing that other people are getting into the act and maybe we shall have to put out our own press releases on what the legislature is specifically doing and I would hope that to start this we would have a report first from Senator DeCamp and then maybe some additions from the other two members who went with him.

PRESIDENT: Just a second. Senator Simpson, this matter is of such broad concern and deep interest that it might develop into a broad discussion when what we really want is a report. We have so many things pending that the Chair would like to urge that you urge Senator DeCamp to give a short concise report at a specific time. Otherwise we will have endless discussion and debate on every conceivable subject.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Mr. President, I would leave it up to either the presiding officer for recognition or if you would wish to the speaker at what time Senator DeCamp would make that report, hopefully today.

PRESIDENT: Alright, I will advise the Legislature that I'm going to recognize Senator DeCamp on a point of privilege of the House at 11:00, for this purpose.
