There's great confusion on the part of the Governor in his veto message on this and I forgot to address myself to it. The Governor seems to think that people are going back to the reformatory on work and education release. He knows as well as I do, this is not true, it is not contemplated. Work release and education release is a separate type program. You cannot operate it with them going back to the institutions. There is no intent in this bill to do so and in fact, the facility is designed at 200 to 250 with that in mind, and the Governor's people had to change their mind as to the numbers with this one point. That's all I want to say. Otherwise, let's.....
