PRESIDENT: Senator Burrows.

SENATOR BURROWS: Question for Senator DeCamp. What are the specific lines it takes out? I'd like to understand this specific amendment.

CLERK: The specific amendment says, In the Standing Committee amendment to LB 203, Journal page 1421, strike sections 3, 4, and 9. Renumber sections 5 to 8 as sections 3 to 6.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burrows, have you completed your matter?

SENATOR BURROWS: Well, I have a great deal of question that this is a technical amendment. I think it's substantial and I'd like to have time to study it a little bit. I'd like to see it in writing.

PRESIDENT: I don't know what you mean by time. We're probably moving toward a vote.

SENATOR BURROWS: Well, I would oppose returning the bill for this specific amendment without knowing a great more detail in what we're doing on it.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to close debate, Senator DeCamp?

SENATOR DECAMP: Sure, I'll close. It certainly is a technical correction. Now, that affects or involves a very significant matter does not change the fact that it corrects it to leave it which was intended, which was a reporting bill. The remnants in the bill now are not complete to go the other direction which is to divest corporations of their land and we did take out the language that dealt with that concept and we thought we had it all. We did not have it all. The reason we did not have it all has been traced back to the fact that a secretary who typed the thing started at the top of the page instead of in the middle of the page where it was marked start. So, all I can tell you is it is very simply a technical correction to keep it a reporting bill.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the bill LB 203 be returned for a specific amendment? Record your vote. Have you voted? Please vote. I think I know what Senator DeCamp is going to ask for, would you please vote. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 2 nays on motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DECAMP: I move the amendment be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Any discussion? The question is the adoption of the amendment. Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President.
