SENATOR BARNETT: Mr. President, is everybody in here? Is there enough people in here?

PRESIDENT: Please vote.

SENATOR BARNETT: Thank you.

PRESIDENT: You bet. It's alright, anytime. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on motion to return.

I've got with me today my wife and my youngest daughter and there's a couple little people with them that are pretty good friends of hers. They live about a half a block away. The little guy, Brian and Wendy Svoboda. Brian is the young man, if you'll remember, when President Ford was here last Fall I believe it was that wrote to the President and asked the chance to meet him. When he came into town he met him. Now he wants to meet the Lieutenant Governor and the Governor and everything. So this is Brian Svoboda and his little sister Wendy, and my daughter Bobbi standing right over here. I'd like to introduce them to you.

PRESIDENT: Nice to have all of you here. Brian, if you live in Senator Barnett's district it's too bad you're not older.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 522. There are E & R amendments.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 522.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? All those in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The amendments are adopted.
