CLERK: 28 ayes, 14 nays.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries. Senator George.

SENATOR GEORGE: Mr. President, I move to advance the bill.

PRESIDENT: Question is, shall the bill be advanced. All those in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Kennedy asked to be excused at 3:45 until he returns. Senator DeCamp from 3:30 to 4.

Mr. President, a letter from Secretary of State, Allen Beermann, acknowledging receipt of LB 606 with the duly certified attachments certifying its passage by the Legislature notwithstanding the action of the Governor.

Mr. President, I have some reports on your committee, Enrollment and Review, reports we have examined and reviewed LB 203 and recommend it be replaced on Select File as amended; LB 571 replaced on Select File as amended; LB 472 replaced on Select File as amended; LB 410 replaced on Select File as amended. Signed, Senator Dworak, Chairman.

Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to take LB 386 ahead of the listing by the Speaker. Signed, Senator Savage.

PRESIDENT: Senator Savage makes a request for unanimous consent to take a bill out of the Speaker's order. Is there an objection? There's an objection.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I'll make a motion to that effect then.

PRESIDENT: We'll just get into protracted debate on taking it out of order, but the Chair will hear you Senator.

SENATOR SAVAGE: I've had a request from the Board of Examiners of the Architects and Engineers that they are losing money on the examinations which are coming up currently. We have this bill . . . this bill will recover the actual costs of these examinations and it's a non-controversial bill. It should only take a couple of minutes. As far as I'm concerned if it does have opposition I'll drop it right away. This is an emergency request.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, Senator Savage after this . . . asked if this bill could be brought up out of order and I declined to do so. I said if you can get 25 votes on this floor then you can do what you care to. I just wanted to alert the body that this is the reason why this subject up for discussion at this time. I refused to change because we had a lottery system to determine the order of bills. If it's the pleasure of this body with 25 votes to do so, that is the question before the house.
