PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, if you recall a few moments ago I warned about taking bills out of order. This was the decision made by this body, by myself with the drawing of numbers over here at the press desk here. I'm concerned about our actions the last few minutes. This was the decision of the body, I so indicated when I expressed my opposition to this first move, then of course the other . . . the final moves . . . or other moves. I'm going back and if this body is so inclined it can override me. As your Speaker I'm going to say we're going to follow the order as was declared sometime ago and it is on that blackboard at this time. That's the Speaker's order.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, are all of those amendments that were offered withdrawn then? Mr. President, I would request those amendments that were offered for those bills to be replaced in line preceeding any other bills be withdrawn or I would move to adjourn siney die.

PRESIDENT: Well that isn't a properly phrased motion or request.

SENATOR MILLS: I ask for unanimous consent for those to withdraw their motions to move their bills ahead of priority bills.

PRESIDENT: The Clerk advises me that they are withdrawn, Senator Mills. Alright, now we revert back to the Speakers order. (mic inactivated).

CLERK: Mr. President, there are a series of bills which were returned to Select File for E & R amendments only. Those bills could properly be advanced with no debate in as much as there are no amendments on them.

PRESIDENT: Read the bills and we'll have Senator Dworak move them.

CLERK: 203 is the first one.

SENATOR DWORAK: Are there amendments on these?

CLERK: Yes.

SENATOR DWORAK: I move the adoption of the E & R amendments to LB 203.

PRESIDENT: Discussion? The question is the adoption of the E & R amendments to 203. All those in favor say aye, contrary nay. They are adopted.
