SENATOR SAVAGE: There are no other lights. Senator Mahoney, did you wish to close? Did you wish to close, Senator Mahoney? There are no other lights.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Mr. President, I would close by again making my plea that I think the bill itself is of great important. I believe that if there's ever anything that we are elected to is the fact that we must, from time to time, separate ourselves from the position of the executive branch being able to hold a veto type of fear over our heads. I think as everybody sits in their seats today that if they do everything in their power I would like to see them override this veto because I truly believe that this is one bill that will have plenty of progress for Nebraska, and should be overridden.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Alright, the question is shall LB 611 become law notwithstanding the objection by the Governor. Please vote.

(President Whelan presiding).

PRESIDENT: Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: Voting aye Senators Burbach, Cavanaugh, Chambers, Cope, DeCamp, Fitzgerald, Goodrich, Johnson, Koch, F. Lewis, Luedtke, Mahoney, Moylan, Nichol, Rasmussen, Savage, Schmit, Skarda, Stoney and Swigart.

Voting nay Senators Barnett, Bereuter, Burrows, Carsten, Clark, Dickinson, Dworak, Fowler, George, Kelly, Kennedy, Keyes, Kime, Kremer, R. Lewis, Maresh, Marsh, Marvel, Mills, Murphy, Simpson, Stull, Syas, Warner and Wiltse.

Not voting Senators Anderson, Duis, Hasebroock, ... Senator Anderson voting no. And Senator Rumery voting no. Senator Hasebroock voting aye.

21 ayes, 26 nays, 3 not voting.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a communication from the Governor under date of May 22nd which was just received during the debate on the last motion. (Read communication from Governor found on pages 2065 thru 2067).
