18 ayes, 30 nays, 1 not voting.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails.

CLERK: The next one on the desk is LR 102. Introduced by Senator J. W. Burbach. (Read title). The resolution will be laid over and printed in the Journal, and considered tomorrow.

Mr. President, LR 39 is ready for your signature, as well as LR 46.

Mr. President, the next item, in the absence of something else, is the consideration of LR 65. LR 65 is introduced by Senator Rasmussen. It's found on page 1908 of the Legislative Journal. (Read title).

PRESIDENT: Senator Rasmussen.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Mr. President, members of the body. This resolution came about through Doctor Polk, a regent who consulted to Senator Burrows and myself. He thought it would be a very good idea if the body here would go on record as being in favor of building the Veterinary Science Complex here in Nebraska. I would ask for its adoption.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dickinson.

SENATOR DICKINSON: Question of Senator Rasmussen, Mr. President.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Yes sir.

SENATOR DICKINSON: This is so stated in my condensed title and by you, it is a conclusion that there is going to be one by the five state ...

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: According to him the prospects of one is very, very good. Nebraska is one of the sites under selection. His idea is that it would be perhaps ... perhaps it might have a little influence on whoever is the consulting engineers are to decide if we would ...

SENATOR DICKINSON: Well I certainly agree that if there is going to be one there's no place like Nebraska.

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: I would agree to that.

PRESIDENT: Senator Shirley Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I have several questions for Senator Rasmussen please

SENATOR RASMUSSEN: Surely.

SENATOR MARSH: Was the decision made by one of our regents that this is what the legislative body ought to do?
