I think we have 680 still out here in limbo and I want to make sure that Senator Murphy's motion now covers 680. Senator Murphy, is that your understanding that it not only covers all but it also covers 680 which is already out here as referred by the Exec Board or the Reference Committee.

SENATOR MURPHY: Like I say, the ghost of Christmas past, present and future and I guess that would include..

SENATOR GOODRICH: 680 is included.

SENATOR MURPHY: Yes, sir.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of Senator Murphy's motion. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Motion carries.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 299 was read this morning and laid over. The Committee amendments were adopted and no further action was taken. The bill, Mr. President, is introduced originally by Senator Kennedy.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to move the advancement of the bill, Senator Kennedy? All right. Senator Syas.

SENATOR SYAS: I thought it was just the opposite, that the Committee amendments were not adopted. I thought we were back to the original bill. Well, of course, what all the steam was about was the Committee amendments.

CLERK: That is right but all that came after the amendments were adopted.

SENATOR SYAS: The what?

CLERK: All the discussion about whether they should be adopted came after they had been adopted.

SENATOR SYAS: Then I move that we don't adopt them and go back to the original bill. I think that is what they want to do around here. Now you can pick on that if you want to.

PRESIDENT: Senator Syas, the Chair is not sure what you moved. Could you put it in writing.

SENATOR SYAS: All right. Reconsider our action on adopting the Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: Okay. Any further discussion. Senator Kennedy.

SENATOR KENNEDY: After our leisure afternoon, I thought we kind of had pretty much of a settlement before lunch and the Committee amendments were adopted and I want to be sure that everyone understands what we are doing now. We would be rescinding our action on the Committee amendments.
