SENATOR SIMPSON: Standing committee amendments, as amended, are adopted.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, there are no further amendments pending.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Burbach, what shall we do with the bill?

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I move we advance LB 248 for E & R initial. I believe it's been pretty well discussed. Pretty much of the amendments which have been adopted relate to the bill, other than now we have a uniform standard for inspections, it's uniform throughout the state. The other amendment which Senator Bereuter offered which has to do with the planning of where the placement should be set, etc.... I move the bill be advanced to E & R for initial.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Any further discussion? If not, the motion is to advance. All in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Clerk will record.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 0 nays, 19 not voting on motion to advance.

SENATOR SIMPSON: The bill is advanced. Next bill, LB 596.

CLERK: Read title to LB 596. There are no committee amendments or other amendments pending.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Burbach, what shall we do with the bill?

SENATOR BURBACH: I move to advance LB 596 to E & R for initial. This was a bill that was introduced several years, two years ago possibly. It had to do with enlistment and some certain monies and recognition given to those who enlist in the National Guard. The compliment has been filled. Those people who are in charge of the National Guard are agreeable, and the Governor is agreeable that this shall now be taken off of the Statute. This is one of the cases where many of our constituents say 'Don't you fellas ever repeal a bill?' Well here's a case that we're going to repeal a bill that was adopted several years ago by this body. I hope you agree.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Is there any further discussion on the bill? If not, the motion is to advance 596. All in favor vote aye, those opposed vote nay. Voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Simpson voting aye.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Have you all voted? Clerk's recording.
