position, we hold a bill for a motion pending if someone isn't here, don't we? Don't we hold a bill for that?

PRESIDENT: That is why the Chair wants the body to decide what to do with this bill. The Chair is not going to suggest anything in this case.

SENATOR CLARK: I would suggest we hold the bill until Senator DeCamp arrives. It couldn't make any difference of one day. Certainly in courtesy to him we ought to do that. We do it for everyone else.

PRESIDENT: Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, I have talked to Senator Clark and I believe he is against the bill. Why doesn't he, then, just make the motion to kill it or somebody else? And I will tell you why I do this, because the bill was originally delayed because I wasn't here one day. So it has been up there and it has been pending and now it comes up and here is another delay of the bill. One of those who is opposed to the bill could just make the motion to kill it.

SENATOR CLARK: Senator DeCamp has the motion to kill. I don't.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: All right, then if it is to be done by a motion, then I would move that in disregard of Senator DeCamp's motion, the bill as amended be advanced. I don't know how else to frame the motion.

PRESIDENT: Just a simple motion to advance then. All right. Then, Senator Chambers phrased it this way, in disregard of the motion to kill, he moves to advance so that he has properly set it in a frame. So the question is, shall the bill be advanced, I suppose to be fair, notwithstanding the motion to kill. Record your vote. Have you voted? This takes 25 votes in Select File. Have you voted? Please vote. We have two Senators waiting to pounce. Record. Senator Stoney.

SENATOR STONEY: Mr. President, I would ask for a Call of the House. Roll call vote, please.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the House go under Call? All those in favor, say aye. Contrary nay. Wait, I am sorry that is record vote. Record your vote on going under Call. Record. Vince, record the vote to go under Call.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. All Senators please take your chairs and record your presence. Senator George voting aye on the original proposition. Did someone request a roll call vote? All right. There has been a request for a roll call vote on the motion to advance. Please take your chairs so that we can commence the roll call as soon as possible. Record your presence. Please
