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leadership of 605. This legislature was to answer. Now if this Legislature does not answer it is my opinion that the Legislature is saying no. Now when it says no, Tom Doyle says that that says yes, that I think that they are completely out of line.

SENATOR MURPHY: I guess that the only other thing that I could say was that I would join with my friend Senator Syas and I think that if an artists work has to be explained then the artist has failed. We have already struck down the proposition that alternative art might be introduced, so I think that I will maybe go and make a phone call when the vote comes.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills.

SENATOR MILLS: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I have a question of Senator Kelly. Senator Kelly, I have heard State Engineer, Tom Doyle's name brought up several times by you and other members of the Legislature, tell me the affect of the Attorney General's opinion that was issued to Senator Bereuter and Senator Savage, did it not say that it really did not make any difference what this legislature wanted to do or not, isn't that correct? We don't really have any business in it or not, isn't that correct?

SENATOR KELLY: It isn't that easy to answer, Senator Mills, but give me thirty seconds. Get your watch going. The Attorney General's opinion to Bereuter says that it is personal property until it gets on the real estate then it is real property. The one to Savage says that the Department of Roads does have statutory authority to approve these on their own without the approval of the Governor or the Legislature.

SENATOR MILLS: Thank you. The Department of Roads has the right to accept these as the Attorney General has just said. I want to ask you members of the Legislature to remember that as written to Senator Savage in his request. I want to ask one more question of you, Senator Kelly. You alluded to the fact that, and I think that this is important to the people in the State of Nebraska that it could cost \$25,000-30,000 and so you said that you grabbed that figure from the air, is that correct?

SENATOR KELLY: That is correct.

SENATOR MILLS: In other words you could grab another figure and say \$5,000, is that correct?

SENATOR KELLY: Yes, you could.

SENATOR MILLS: You could in fact grab a figure that said \$10 so that the figure that you gave, Senator Kelly, the \$25,000-30,000, I know in your own heart that you think it might be that, but it really does not mean a thing.

SENATOR KELLY: Not a thing.
