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which dealt with the comprehensive overhaul of all traffic laws and rules and regulations, it was determined that there ought to be a look at the point system as it exists in Nebraska. As a result there was considerable attention given to the point system during the following interim. At the....when the Legislature was in session in 1975 a bill was drafted which did make reference to at least several sections of the point system. As a result the committee adopted an amendment that you find on page 4 of the bill, on line 15, which relates to all other traffic violations. Now in explaining all other traffic violations other than those that are spelled out in the sections that appear in the earlier part of the bill you are referring there to a traffic violation such as going through a stop sign, making an illegal turn or driving too close to another vehicle or some things of that nature. It was the thinking of the committee, at least most of the committee, that the assessment of points for those violations should be changed from 2 points to one point. That is the committee amendment and I move for its adoption.

SENATOR SAVAGE PRESIDING.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Any discussion? Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Mr. Chairman, members of the Legislature. I like it whenever we open up the point system for question, but I'm not trying to do what happened last session. I just want to call Senator Kremer and the committees attention to the fact that a provision was adopted last session which would allow no points to be assessed if you happened to be driving without your drivers license in your possession. So, that ought to be noted in this particular section, because if it is repealed as it is attempting to do, this particular section that is now statute that provision which would allow no points for driving without a drivers license in your pocket would be repealed also. I think that there should be no points for driving without that license. So, if you would allow me to offer an amendment to the committee amendment, I would say that the provision and we will get the language together which allows the assessment of no points for driving without a license in your possession, should be added to this committee amendment.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Kremer.

SENATOR KREMER: Senator Chambers, you will remember that that action was taken before we considered this bill. So, it was not the intent of the committee in no way at all to annul what we did last session. Do you understand that? I'm in perfect agreement to do what Senator Chambers has asked to be done at this point. We in no way want to interfere with the action that we took last session.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Is it not true that in E & R that we automatically do that? The question that Senator Chambers brought up was a bill that we passed last time. E & R will automatically change LB265 to coincide with that.
