CLERK: Senator Johnson voting aye on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Mills, would you record your presence. Senator Cavanaugh, record your presence please. Senator Kremer voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Kremer voting aye. Senator Savage voting aye. Senator Syas voting negative.

PRESIDENT: Senator Maresh voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Cavanaugh voting no. Senator Maresh voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Kime voting no. Senator Skarda voting no. Senator Kelly voting aye. Senator ... only one, Senator Kelly.

CLERK: Senator Bereuter voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Swigart voting aye.

CLERK: Swigart voted aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Keyes voting no. Senator DeCamp, with his left hand, voting aye. You've already got him on the right hand though. Senator Burbach moves that the Call be raised. All those in favor say aye, contrary say nay. The Call is raised. Report the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 13 nays on motion to advance.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, we have one new bill. Read title to LB 784 and LB 785.

PRESIDENT: Mr. Speaker, do you have an announcement for the Legislature?

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. I've been informed by the Bill Drafter that his workload is as such that we should make a definite determination at this time that any bills that need to be drafted or wish to be drafted must be in his hands at 5 o'clock on Friday. He is not in the position ... No, tomorrow is Thursday, sir. Day after tomorrow, that's right. On Tuesday is the 10th day. He'll need some additional time for catching up on his work. I want to caution the body that if you have any bills that you wish to have drafted, please have them to the Bill Drafter by day after tomorrow, at 5 o'clock on Friday.
