SENATOR DWORAK: I call for the question.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall LB 310 be indefinitely postponed? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 14 ayes, 18 nays.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move that LB 310 be advanced to E & R Initial.

PRESIDENT: Discussion. The question is, shall the bill be advanced? Record. Have you voted? Have you all voted? Record. Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I move for a Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the House go under Call? Record your vote. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 10 nays.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. All Senators return to your desk and record your presence. Senator Cavanaugh votes aye on the original proposition.

CLERK: Senator Cavanaugh voting aye, changing from no to aye.

PRESIDENT: All Senators record your presence. Senator Mills voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Mills voting aye, changing from no to aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol voting aye.

CLERK: Senator Nichol voting aye.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak asks that the Call be raised. All those in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The Call is raised. Report the vote.

CLERK: 25 ayes.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced.

CLERK: 8 nays, the remainder not voting. Mr. President, there will be inserted in the Legislative Journal a Reference Report referring LB 798 through 813. Signed by members of the Executive Board, Senator Mahoney, Chairman. Mr. President, that is all I have. I have a motion to adjourn until 9:30 a.m., Monday. Signed Senator Burbach.
