So I would ask this body for unanimous consent to recognize those two bills and only those two bills, that no one comes into the bill drafter with any more, only two bills.

PRESIDENT: Does this require a suspension of the rules, Senator? In your opinion.

SENATOR BURBACH: I don't believe a unanimous consent would. Is this right, Vince? I am asking unanimous consent that we give consideration to those two bills. We need to suspend the rules, then?

PRESIDENT: I don't think unanimous consent today would help you at all. I think you have to suspend the rules to accomplish what you want.

SENATOR BURBACH: I would just bring this to this body so they are alerted to a problem of a problem of malfunction of a machine and this has been verified by the drafting department and Senator Schmit and Senator Goodrich should be accorded that special privilege of introducing their two bills tomorrow rather than us to wait another hour or half hour here tonight.

PRESIDENT: Fine.

CLERK: I move we adjourn until 9 o'clock, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. We are adjourned until 9:00 tomorrow morning.
