PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered.

CLERK: Read title to LR 112. The resolution will be printed in the Journal.

Read title to LR 113. It will be printed in the Journal.

Mr. President, there's a Reference Committee Report. LB 922 through 933. Signed by the members of the Reference Committee.

Mr. President, Senator Carsten asked to be excused till he gets here Thursday. Signed, Senator Carsten.

Mr. President, I ask unanimous consent to withdraw my name as the co-introducer of LB 934. Signed, Senator Schmit.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it's so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, there's another resolution as follows, as signed by Senator Clark. Thanking Mr. Jim Pittenger for his thoughtfulness that he has demonstrated in his work on our behalf and that the Legislature wishes him a quick and complete recovery from the stroke. That will be laid over, Mr. President.

Mr. President, Senator Savage has pending a motion to withdraw LB 708.

PRESIDENT: Excuse me. Before I recognize you, Senator Savage, the Speaker asked to be recognized.

SENATOR BURBACH: Mr. President, members of the Legislature. It is in order to consider Senator Savage's LB 708 in just a moment. I'd like to put out a few more words here. Senator Clark is in the same position. Now that's an error in the agenda that Senator Clark's bill was not also written ... spelled out. I have several other errors. I'll explain to you the reason why there are errors this morning. LB 177 should not be considered. It's bracketed in such a way until after LB 477 is entirely disposed of, whatever the case might be.

We also have LB 451. A decision was made, yesterday, to bracket that till 3-1. LB 579, a decision was made yesterday morning to bracket that to 1-23. LB 585 was bracketed yesterday for January 22.

I can tell you why these errors happened yesterday. If you recall we were in session very late. We could not get the Journal. The Journal was printed after we left for home which was 5:30, 6 o'clock. Therefore, we did not have access to the records of what transpired on the floor yesterday. Hopefully, these things will never happen again. Yesterday for the first time an aid, who has been assigned and who is working with the office ... my office ... His responsibility will be to check these things so we do have a more accurate agenda in the future. Hopefully, this is the last time I'll have to get up and apologize for errors in the agenda.
