I think a Resolution like this would just be fine from the Legislature and I would move for the adoption of it.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? The question is the adoption of LR 114. Record your vote. Have all of you voted? Record.

CLERK: 39 ayes, Mr. President, and 0 nays.

PRESIDENT: The Resolution is adopted.

CLERK: There will be a Reference Report inserted in the Journal, Mr. President. See 337, Journal. There is an Attorney General's opinion #164 addressed to Senator Fowler. See pages 335 and 336, Journal. Mr. President, your Committee on Judiciary to whom was referred LB 629 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature the recommendation it be advanced to General File as amended. Mr. President, notice of Committee Hearings by Miscellaneous Subjects. Signed Senator Anderson, Chairman. See page 337, Journal. Mr. President, Senator Rasmussen asked unanimous consent to move the hearings on Friday of the Government Committee to the West Chamber.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? That is the hearing Friday to this Chamber of the Government Committee. Seeing no objection, it is so ordered.

CLERK: Mr. President, a motion on the desk. Read. See page 337, Journal. Signed Senator DeCamp.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator DeCamp.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, Senator Burbach can explain this. This is a request that was in the bill drafter. It is my 10th bill and it was there a long time ago and it got screwed up somewhere.

PRESIDENT: All right. It is the same situation Senator George had?

SENATOR DeCAMP: Ask Senator Burbach.

PRESIDENT: Senator Burbach, is that correct?

SENATOR BURBACH: Yes, this is correct and there is a letter here from Bruce Cutshall indicating the same thing.

PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, shall the Rules be suspended to allow Senator DeCamp to introduce this bill? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 31 ayes to suspend the Rules.

PRESIDENT: The Rules are suspended. Read the title, Mr. Clerk. Well, Senator DeCamp.

CLERK: LB 968 introduced by Senator DeCamp. Read title. See page 337, Journal.
