CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays.

SENATOR SAVAGE: The Kelly amendments are adopted.

CLERK: Now, Mr. President, there are some more amendments. The next ones are offered by Senator Duis. (Read Duis amendment found on page 367 of the Journal).

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Duis.

SENATOR DUIS: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment. The amendment was brought to me by the Department of Aeronautics. It's an amendment to permit them to approve landing areas. They're doing this from a safety standpoint. Apparently, during the last year or so--not fortunately in Nebraska, some places they've had some trouble with helicopter in a crowded shopping area where they've had an accident. They wish to get in here that they will be able to have notice if this is going to happen, and approve this landing area in order to promote safety amongst the citizens of our State of Nebraska.

SENATOR SAVAGE: You've heard the Duis amendment. Is there any further discussion? Hearing none, all those in favor of the Duis amendment vote aye, opposed vote nay. Savage voting aye. Record. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Motion carries.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion offered is by ... there's a series ... at least more than one. There are three offered by Senator Maresh who is not present.

SENATOR SAVAGE: We'll pass those over till.... Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, those are perfunctory amendments by Senator Maresh. I would offer to handle those amendments for Senator Maresh. They're....

CLERK: Mr. President. the first one then is found on page 167 of the Legislative Journal. It adds the emergency clause, the same as Duis's amendment, plus some other things.

SENATOR SAVAGE: Senator Kelly, do you wish to....

SENATOR KELLY: Yes, Mr. President. The thrust of the Maresh amendment is merely to do away with paying tuition on airport properties out of the General Fund and use the Department's cash fund to pay that tuition which is a reduction in General Fund that would go to the Department. It is the only money that the Aeronautics Department uses ... is General Fund money to pay this tuition. They would prefer to pay it with their own cash funds.

CLERK: Mr. President, there's a request by Senator Maresh to withdraw the amendments printed in the Journal and to substitute another set. It's similar to the one in the Journal. (Read Maresh amendment found on page 368 of Journal).
