I believe it to be a very excellent move. I do request that you support the amendment.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: The question is shall the Maresh amendment be adopted. All in favor vote aye. If you're opposed vote nay. Record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 6 nays, 18 not voting.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: There are no further amendments.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator....

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I move we advance LB 460 as amended.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: All in favor say aye, all opposed no. LB 460 is advanced.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 584 is a bill that we have adopted the E & R amendments. There is an amendment pending by Senator Luedtke. (Read Luedtke amendment found on page 368 of the Journal).

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Mr. President, I move the adoption of the amendment. Mr. President, members of the Legislature. This amendment was actually a committee amendment but did not get on the bill at the time we placed it on General File because it had not been prepared by the Bill Drafter. Thank you, Senator Cavanaugh, for waking everybody up so they can pay attention to the amendment.

This particular amendment is technical in nature in that it deals with inheritance taxes and wants to make certain that the Attorney General and the Tax Commissioner will be joined in any actions regarding ... estate tax purposes. If it's inheritance tax purposes, which are administered on the county level ... that's the (b) portion of it. It would be the Attorney General and the county attorney for Nebraska inheritance tax purposes.

The two ... Two technical changes to make the proper relationship between the Attorney General, the Tax Commissioner and the Attorney General and the county attorney.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: No further discussion? Senator Swigart.

SENATOR SWIGART: Would Senator Luedtke... Mr. President and colleagues. Would Senator Luedtke yield to a question?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Yes, Senator.

SENATOR SWIGART: Would you please advise us, what was the final figures now that it changes from what...from \$25,000 to what? What's the final figure now?

SENATOR LUEDTKE: There's nothing like that in this bill.
