SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, very briefly, there is nothing that precludes somebody from having a liquor license being on there now, and if a qualified person in this particular area should be appointed, he can be appointed now. There is nothing stopping that type of person from being appointed, and I agree with Senator Marsh and Senator Skarda that this changes the direction of the bill considerably, and with this new thought in it, I think it should be subjected to public hearing and I would not support this amendment.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Any further discussion on the amendment? Senator Dworak and Skarda, would you shut off your lights please? Senator DeCamp will close on his amendment.

SENATOR DeCAMP: Mr. President, as I suggested too, the Nebraska Retailers felt they wanted somebody on this Commission with at least some experience or knowledge of the industry. I might mention to you that we have pretty much put this requirement in on just about every other type of Commission we have, whether it is Natural Resources or whatever. We say there shall be somebody on this or that familiar with the industry. That is all the retailers are asking. Do what you want on it?

SENATOR SIMPSON: All right. The question is the adoption of the DeCamp amendment. All in favor vote aye. Those opposed vote nay. Have you voted? The Clerk will record.

CLERK: 10 ayes, 18 nays, Mr. President.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Motion lost. Further motions on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have is a motion by Senator Cavanaugh to indefinitely postpone LB 412.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Cavanaugh, do you wish this motion to be considered on the bill to indefinitely postpone? If you do, the bill will be laid over until tomorrow?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I have a motion to indefinitely postpone it? I do.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Yes. John J. Cavanaugh. What are your wishes on the motion?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: That is me. What is the bill?

SENATOR SIMPSON: LB 412.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I mean, I don't recall. Oh, it has to be laid over?
