SENATOR DICKINSON: I will withdraw it.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Senator Cavanaugh, do you wish to close on your amendment?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Ask Senator DeCamp a question.

SENATOR SIMPSON: Does Senator DeCamp yield to a question? Yes.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Senator DeCamp, you see no conflict in requiring that the people have a direct interest in the outcome. Now, you understand and you know that this is different than the professions and the medical associations. Maybe Senator Kennedy doesn't understand that. People who sit on those Boards determine the individual standards of other people in that profession. Here, let me ask you this. Is the idea of the Board to protect the public interest? Allegedly. Is that why this legislation was introduced here because we have a public need that is not being met by the laws?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I think the purpose of the Board is much broader than just that but go ahead.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: What do you mean, broader than that?

SENATOR DeCAMP: The public interest includes development of the trade, benefit to commerces, all in the public interest so I think if we are going to use that word, you had better define what you mean by it so we are not talking apples and oranges.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Does this Board provide that anyone may serve who does not have a direct monetary interest in the business?

SENATOR DeCAMP: You have read the bill. You know what it provides.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: You do too. Does it?

SENATOR DeCAMP: I am not going to sit here subject to cross examination. You have read the bill. I have read the bill.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Doesn't it require that you have a direct monetary interest in the business in order to be eligible for this Board?

SENATOR DeCAMP: No. If you want me to read the bill for you and explain it to you, I will be happy to.

SENATOR SIMPSON: No dialogue on the floor.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: No. That is sufficient, Senator DeCamp. Your demeanor and unwillingness to answer the questions candidly and honestly serves the purpose that that's what the bill requires that you have a direct interest in modular housing in order to serve on the
