to do is put an amendment on it that I have on the Clerk's desk up there to add \$200,000 in revolving fund money for the license plates out at the Penitentiary. This is money they get from the Motor Vehicles Department. They do not have authorization to spend it. They are going to have to lay off people and I am not talking about convicts laying off, but they are going to have to lay off people out there if they don't get the \$200,000 authorization. I would like to have it brought back. I would like to have the amendment put on it so that it could carry them through February. Then we will have a more exact figure at the end of February so we can carry them on through the year, but this is imperative. They have to have the money now and so I would ask to have the bill brought back. Senator Anderson, I am sure, is in agreement with it. I talked to him.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is to return LB 581 to Select File for specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Anderson.

SENATOR ANDERSON: Mr. President, members of the body, Senator Clark, as well as members of the Fiscal Analyst Staff, have spoken to me about this particular problem and I agree that it is something that needs to be taken care of and that LB 581 is an appropriate vehicle for doing it so I support the motion to bring it back.

PRESIDENT: All right. You have heard the motion. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on motion to return.

PRESIDENT: The bill is returned. Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: I move the adoption of the amendment. All this does is add \$200,000 in revolving fund money. It adds no General Fund money at all, merely the authorization to keep the license plates being made out there. I ask for the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 33 ayes, Mr. President, on motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: It is adopted. Senator Clark.

SENATOR CLARK: Mr. President, I would move to put the bill back to E & R and ask that it be expedited. I think he can have it up here in an hour. We can put it back on the Board and have a reading on it next week early. I would move for the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: All right. The motion is, shall the bill be advanced? All those in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The bill is advanced. There is a request for unanimous consent to expedite the bill. Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is so ordered. Senator Luedtke, for what purpose do you arise?
