SENATOR LUEDTKE: I would request the opportunity to withdraw LB 275A, which we promised we would do, and I would make a motion to do it.

PRESIDENT: So that lays over a day.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Well, if it has to, it has to.

PRESIDENT: For this purpose, we will go to General File and then we will return to Select File immediately. The Chair recognizes Senator Luedtke.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: I would ask unanimous consent to unbracket LB 275A.

PRESIDENT: Is there an objection? Seeing none, it is unbracketed. Senator.

SENATOR LUEDTKE: Now, then, I guess the only motion we can make today is to indefinitely postpone LB 275A and I would so move.

PRESIDENT: All right. Is there any discussion? The question is, shall LB 275A be indefinitely postponed? Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The bill is indefinitely postponed. Now can we go to LB 76? All right. We are back on Select File.

CLERK: Mr. President, LB 76 was bracketed to today. Mr. President, LB 76 had previously been advanced and then was returned for a specific amendment offered by Senator Murphy. That amendment is yet pending. The specific amendment is found on page 422 and it reads as follows: Read amendment.

SENATOR MURPHY: Mr. Chairman.

PRESIDENT: Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: I simply would move the adoption of this amendment and hope that someone would kill it before it is all over, but most certainly, this amendment will clarify exactly what these funds are. The information has been circulated to you indicating the extent of the impact that could result from this bill and I am sure that no one in this body intends to impose that on their local school boards. So I would move the adoption of the amendment and I suppose really, in courtesy to Senator Lewis, he should be given an opportunity. It was his motion to bracket and it is his bill. I simply move the adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Do you want to be recognized, Senator Kelly?

SENATOR KELLY: Not on this.
