PRESIDENT: All right. The question is, the adoption of Senator Murphy's amendment? Record. All right. Senator Murphy.

SENATOR MURPHY: A Call of the House.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall the House go under Call. Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 9 nays to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: The House is under Call. All Senators please take your chairs and record your presence. Please take your chairs, Senators. Senator Murphy, you asked for the Call. Could you have those other Senators take their chairs?

CLERK: Senator Marsh voting no on the original motion.

PRESIDENT: Record your presence, please. Senator Cavanaugh is voting.

CLERK: Senator Cavanaugh voting no on the original motion. Senator Anderson voting aye on the original motion. Senator Mahoney voting no. Senator Mills voting no. Senator Burbach voting aye. Senator Rumery voting no. Senator Burrows voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Cavanaugh, for what purpose do you ask recognition?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: A point of information from Senator Murphy, if we could.

PRESIDENT: We are in the process of voting, Senator. What type of information?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: It is my understanding he and Senator Lewis have been involved in this bill. I was just wondering if Senator Lewis was aware of this motion.

PRESIDENT: We are in the process of voting. Read the motion, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the motion is to adopt the specific amendment found on page 422 of the Journal which reads: Read. Senator Luedtke voting no on the original motion. Senator Frank Lewis voting no.

PRESIDENT: Senator Bereuter voting no. Senator Skarda no and Senator Goodrich no. Senator Chambers votes no. Senator Savage votes no. There is a motion to raise the Call by Senator Lewis. All those in favor say aye. Contrary say nay. The Call is raised. Report the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 15 ayes, 16 nays to adopt the specific amendment.

PRESIDENT: Motion fails. For what purpose do you ask recognition, Senator Lewis?
