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Lincoln and defend a law case. That can only cost the people of the State of Nebraska, the taxpayer, or the licensee, or the applicant more money and there is absolutely no justification or reason for it. The various district courts across the state are equally competent and normally we attempt to dispense justice at the location of the controversy or the origination, which in this case is where the person is making the application for the license, and here you would want to move it to Lincoln. Maybe this session of the Legislature is going to become known as the move-to-Lincoln Legislature because there is an awful lot of bills that keep moving across here forcing the citizens of the state to come and transact their business at the Capitol rather than in their home districts. But I, for one, think that we should not encourage that and there is no reason for this bill. I don't know of anybody who supports this bill with the possible exception of the attorney for the Liquor Commission, whom it may convenience or offer some convenience to, but I am not prepared to offer support or enact legislation for the convenience of one rather well paid attorney that works for the State of Nebraska at the expense of very many citizens of the State of Nebraska. I just don't think this bill can be defended and it should be killed.

PRESIDENT: Senator Dworak.

SENATOR DWORAK: Mr. President, I rise in support of Senator Cavanaugh's kill motion. I can't and I just want to echo the thoughts that he put forth and I won't repeat them all, but in my estimation, there is absolutely no reason to have all these appeals in Lancaster County or the District Court here in Lincoln. The district courts outstate, in Omaha, are just as capable, just as competent. The constituency pressure to come to Lincoln rather than have these hearings within their own districts is why put this burden on the constituents. We would have a greater burden of people coming into Lincoln, less people going from Lincoln outstate to hear these particular cases and I would strongly support the kill motion.

PRESIDENT: Senator Barnett.

SENATOR BARNETT: I have got a question of Senator Dworak. Senator Dworak, would you support the issue if we put down there that appeals could be heard at any local beer establishment?

SENATOR DWORAK: I will answer an intelligent question but I won't answer that.

SENATOR BARNETT: I didn't hear you answer it. That is an intelligent question. I am trying to make the bill so you would support it.

PRESIDENT: Senator Anderson.
