PRESIDENT: All rise for the morning prayer.

CHAPLAIN: Prayer.

PRESIDENT: Roll call. The Legislature will please come to order. Record your presence.

CLERK: Quorum present Mr. President. Mr. President, Senators Carsten, Anderson and George request to be excused until they arrive. Senator Murphy asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 917 in the Legislative Journal.

PRESIDENT: Corrections to the Journal.

CLERK: Mr. President, on page 474, line 33 reinsert "Re-" before "Engrossment". That's all.

PRESIDENT: Are there corrections from the floor? Seeing none, the Journal shall stand as corrected by the Clerk. Are there any further committee reports or hearings, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee, Enrollment and Review, reports LB 413 replaced on Select File.

We have an Attorney General's opinion to Senator Warner that will be inserted in the Journal.

Mr. President, Senator Moylan moves to withdraw LB 653 which is in the Constitutional Revision Committee.

PRESIDENT: That will be laid over. Anything further, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The agenda calls for us to be on Final Reading for an hour and 15 minutes. Your rules provides that all Senators shall stay in their own chairs, at their own desk and that no one, other than Senators, be on the floor. The Chair has received some complaint for not enforcing this as strictly as we could. The Chair would like your cooperation so that you do not have to be reminded of this rule.

We, therefore, go to Final Reading. Mr. Clerk.... All Senators, please take your chairs. Mr. Clerk, read, for the final time, LB 219.

CLERK: Read title to LB 219.

I've gone over this with, I think, Senator Luedtke, Senator Kremer; so I'd ask that it be bracketed until we can prepare the amendment and return it.
