SENATOR HASEBROOCK: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, this is a request bill by the Omaha School Employees Retirement System and is supported by the Omaha Board of Education, the School Employees Retirement System and the Omaha Education Association as a desirable improvement in the Omaha School Employees retirement system. This bill would place no additional fiscal impact on the state as the cost for these improvements would be shared by the employees and the school district. An actuarial study has been performed on the bill and provisions have been set out to maintain the actuarial soundness of the retirement system. This proposed legislation will increase future retirement benefits to employees by 20%. This increase in benefits, however, applies only to the future retirement of active employees. These persons already retired are not affected by this bill. The improvement offered in the bill would more
