CLERK: To reconsider. Now, Mr. President, Senator Burbach moves to return LB 613 to Select File for specific amendment, that amendment being to strike the enacting clause.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor... record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 34 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

PRESIDENT: Now read the motion.

CLERK: That was the motion, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: No, the motion was to return for that. Would you read the motion? Then we can lay it over for a day.

CLERK: The motion for the specific amendment is to strike the enacting clause.

PRESIDENT: All right. That will be laid over.

CLERK: Mr. President, two other matters, the Education Committee gives notice of cancellation of hearings and also the resetting of several hearings and Senator Wiltse asks unanimous consent to print amendments to LB 348 in the Journal.

PRESIDENT: We are ready to go on Final Reading. Would all Senators please take your chairs and remain at your desks? The estimated time is 45 minutes. Would all Senators please take your chairs? Senator Skarda, could we start here? All right. Mr. Clerk, read LB 30 on Final Reading.

CLERK: LB 30 introduced by the Nebraska Retirement Systems. Read on Final Reading.

PRESIDENT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 730 pass on Final Reading. Record your vote. LB 30, I mean. I am sorry. Have you voted? Record.

CLERK: Record vote read. See page 514, Journal. 42 ayes, 0 nays, 7 not voting, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: LB 30 passes on Final Reading. For what purpose do you arise?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: A question of Senator Dworak on his bill.

PRESIDENT: No, we are on Final Reading, Senator.

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: Do you have to make a motion?

PRESIDENT: A motion to what?

SENATOR CAVANAUGH: I wanted to ask him how this bill finally got to Final Reading.
