SENATOR WILTSE: I don't see how it can be. It's not in the bill or any part of it.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on motion to adopt.

SENATOR BARNETT: On the motion to advance I'd like to have a record vote.

PRESIDENT: Record your vote on advancement. Will you please vote. Please vote. Record. Senator Kime.

SENATOR WILTSE: Mr. Chairman, I request a roll call vote please.

PRESIDENT: Alright. Call the roll.

SENATOR WILTSE: Call of the House first.

PRESIDENT: Alright. There's a motion to put the House under Call. Record your vote on that matter. Please vote. Have you all voted on this proposition? Record.

CLERK: 19 ayes, 12 nays to go under Call.

PRESIDENT: We're under Call. All Senators please return to your chairs and record your presence. Would the Sergeant-at-Arms secure the presence of all members of the Legislature. Please return to your chairs. We've had a request for a roll call vote. Record your presence please, Senator Mahoney. Senator Marvel. Senator Clark. Senator Lewis. Senator Frank Lewis. Senator Cavanaugh. Senator Rasmussen, would you record your presence. Senator George. Senator Koch. Senator Keyes. How many are excused? None. Would the Sergeant-at-Arms please find Senator Warner. Senator Johnson. Senator Kime. Senator Marsh. Senator Marsh is now in the chamber. Senator Maresh. Please remain in your chairs. Senator Wiltse, may we commence the roll? We're still missing two or three. Commence with the roll. Would the Sergeant-at-Arms still try to find all the Senators including those who recorded their presence and then left. This is a motion to advance Senator Wiltse's bill that was just returned for specific amendment.
