PRESIDENT: We're going to move on to LB 502.

SENATOR MAHONEY: Yes, but in order ... so Senator Dickinson would not get....

PRESIDENT: Turn that microphone off. Please read LB 502 ... or 536.

CLERK: Read title to LB 536.

PRESIDENT: ... is on your desk.

CLERK: Mr. President, a communication from the executive office under date of February 4th addressed to Vincent Brown, Clerk of the Legislature. We have received LB 383. This bill was signed by me on February 4th and delivered to the Secretary of State.

Mr. President, your Committee on Revenue to whom was referred LB 720 instructs me to report the same to the Legislature with the recommendation that it be indefinitely postponed; LB 729 indefinitely postponed; LB 730 indefinitely postponed; 766 indefinitely postponed; 769 indefinitely postponed; 804 indefinitely postponed; 921 indefinitely postponed; 786 ... there's an 804 indefinitely postponed; LB 786 advanced to General File as amended. Signed, Senator Carsten, Chairman.

Mr. President, a report of the Committee on Committees will be inserted in the Journal and set out in full.

Mr. President, a Rules Committee change offered by Senator George and Senator Barnett will be set out in full in the Legislative Journal and referred to the Rules Committee.

Mr. President, I move for the introduction of the attached bill. Signed, Senator Schmit. It's by the Committee on Agriculture and Environment relating to liens. It's request number 1480.

PRESIDENT: Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, this bill provides that the person who provides feed for livestock would have a prior position in the collection of money due to him in the event that the cattle, hogs or other livestock did not produce enough income at the time of sale to pay off all the encumbrances. The situation has become kind of serious in recent years because of the large amount of feeding that's done by individuals off their farm. It also pertains to those areas of the sandhills where the cattle are pastured and the person providing the pasture does not have any claim for the money due him. The Committee regrets that we did not have it ready to be introduced at the proper time. We would request that it be introduced at this time and be referred to the proper committee for a public hearing.
