PRESIDENT: Further discussion of Senator Nichol's amendment? Record your vote. Please vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays on the Nichol motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: Senator Nichol's motion is adopted. Mr. Clerk, anything further? Senator Kelly.

SENATOR KELLY: Mr. President, I move we advance LB 669 to E & R Initial. There is really no reason for a close by reply.

PRESIDENT: Any further discussion on Senator Kelly's motion? Which is to advance the bill. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay.

PRESIDENT: The bill advances. LB 442.

CLERK: LB 442 introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by the members thereof.

PRESIDENT: Senator Marsh, the Committee is prepared to take care of the bill.

SENATOR MARSH: Senator Bereuter.

PRESIDENT: All right. Read the bill.

CLERK: Read title. There are lengthy Committee amendments, Mr. President, by the Appropriations Committee.

PRESIDENT: The Chair recognizes Senator Bereuter.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move for the adoption of the Standing Committee amendments. They will constitute the bill and then I will be happy to discuss those amendments when we consider the bill, itself. So I move for the adoption of the Standing Committee amendments.

PRESIDENT: The question is the adoption of the Committee amendments. Record your vote. Record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 0 nays on motion to adopt.

PRESIDENT: The Committee amendments are adopted. The Chair recognizes Senator Bereuter.

SENATOR BEREUTER: Now, Mr. President, members of the Legislature, the Standing Committee amendments are in their entirety the LB 442 which is presented for your consideration. The purpose of the amendments, and these amendments were developed by joint effort of the legislative fiscal analyst staff working under the direction of our Committee with input from the Executive branch and I believe now that there is complete agreement between the two bodies that we need to have some kind of coordination and control from both the legislative and executive side of the kinds of dollars being spent by state agencies and institutions
